





## City of Highland Park Independence Day Parade

The City of Highland Park and the Park District of Highland Park invite all community members to spotlight "Sweet Home Highland Park" at the 2024 Independence Day Parade. The parade will take place at 1 PM on Thursday, July 4, 2024. This year's parade theme invites residents and business owners to showcase their love for Highland Park in their float design and festive décor. To emphasize Highland Park's spirit of community, neighborhoods are encouraged to collaborate on a shared float or parade entry that embodies something special about Highland Park. Highland Park's beloved tradition of the children's bike and pet parade will be incorporated into the main parade; participating families must complete the application to participate. New this year, all parade participants will be entered into a contest to recognize the entry that best illustrates the "Sweet Home Highland Park" theme in the parade's three entry categories: float, decorated vehicle, and walking/biking unit.

All groups with participants under the age of 18 must include on-site parent/guardians walking with the group. Residents are encouraged to coordinate with their neighbors in submitting a neighborhood application.

- All participants must complete the parade application form and submit the appropriate fee.
- No applications will be accepted after Friday, May 31, 2024.
- Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Late entries or day-of parade entries are *not* accepted.
- The parade is open to Highland Park residents (groups of 10 or more), governments or non-profit organizations serving Highland Park residents, or Highland Park businesses.
- No refunds of entry fees will be granted after Friday, May 31, or due to inclement weather on the day of the parade.

Any items being passed out along the parade route must be done by walking along the curbside of the road and handing these items to onlookers. Entrants throwing items will be removed from the parade with no refund.

**This year's staging area and parade route have changed**. The new parade route will begin at Laurel Avenue and First Street, proceed west on Laurel Avenue to Green Bay Road, then continuing west on Central Avenue and concluding at Sunset Woods

Park. More information about staging assignments, check-in and safety requirements, and the parade route will be shared with participants in June.
