We allow for the use of joint ventures in our Job Order Contracting contracts. We do not have "policy" on this per se. Below is the language we currently have in our JOC solicitations. Due to some recent issues with these JVs being formed at the last minute and not having experience we are considering changing some of the language to include that the experience examples provided must be from the JV not each individual company.

Identify whether the Offeror is or will be structured as a corporation,

Limited Liability Company, general partnership, joint venture, limited partnership, or other form of organization. It should be noted that a Joint Venture is not required to register with the Virginia State Corporation Commission (SCC). Each individual member of the Joint Venture must be registered with the SCC in accordance with § 2.2-4311.2 of the Code of Virginia. As a requirement of submitting a proposal, Joint Venture entities must be properly established with a federal tax ID number.

If a Joint Venture submits a proposal, a Joint Venture Agreement, signed by individuals authorized to bind each member of the Joint Venture into contracts or agreements, must be included in the proposal and this Agreement is subject to approval by the Loudoun County Office of the County Attorney prior to contract award. If the Joint Venture Agreement is not provided in the proposal or is not approved by the Loudoun County Office of the County Attorney, the proposal may be rejected as non-responsive and or non-responsible. Each member of the Joint Venture should submit a Proof of Authority to Transact Business in Virginia form that is contained in this RFP.

So, seeking input on two questions:

1. Leasing in general

I've requested from my boss that purchasing not be asked to lease unless the company we are leasing from caters to municipalities.

In any other lease I've tried to get into, we have problems with the fine print of indemnification, insurance, and legal prohibitions on multi-year contracts. It has been my experience that the only time this has been overcome is with state or government consortium contracts where the companies recognize these issues coming in (i.e. Copier leases). It is also my understanding that the main reason there are so many leases in the corporate world have to do with tax benefits...of which we receive no benefits as we are tax exempt. I see other benefits (when maintenance is a part of the lease, and that if it breaks it is not yours) but those benefits, to me, are somewhat muted when lease agreement fine print terms are in favor of the company leasing the equipment, etc... to the municipality.

Question: How does your municipality approach leasing?

Leasing a Christmas Tree

I've never heard of "renting to own" (AKA Leasing) a Christmas Tree. Nevertheless, I've been asked to seek that as an option when we go out for our holiday decorations. We lease, they store for 9 months out of the year.

Question: Have you ever done that, and how did it work out?

I can't see anything happening but complicating the rental that we normally do.

Please check your state and local statutes to see if they may govern. In Florida, the renewal terms may not exceed the initial term of contract. For example, a 2 year initial term cannot have more than 2 one year renewals. Additionally, there cannot be price increases unless set in the original contract. You can only negotiate for lower pricing at renewal time. This can be beneficial at renewal time if the contracted firm wants to keep your business.
