I'd like to share a list of organizations and resources that will be on-site over the next week to assist with incident debriefing. We encourage all sworn officers to take advantage of at least one of these on-site options, but welcome you to attend all. Peer support is critical to the success of these programs. They are meant to bring you together in support of each other to discuss, reflect, and counsel.

Northern Illinois Critical Incident Stress Management (NI-CISM) will be on site Friday and Saturday from 2:00 PM - 10:00 PM for drop-ins. They will be located in the first floor Police Training Room. We encourage all officers involved in Monday's incident and response to check in and meet with a peer resource as time allows. No advanced appointment is necessary.

Lake County Family Service will be holding group debriefing sessions in the Police first floor small eonference room Police Training Room Friday at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM for sworn and civilian staff wishing to debrief their experience in a group setting with counselor facilitation. No advance appointment is necessary. These sessions are open to all. An invitation has also been extended to our CERT members present for Monday's incident.

ATF Peer Responder Program is scheduled to be on-site next week for group sessions with peer facilitators experienced in crisis incident debriefing. Exact dates and times are TBD, but multiple sessions will be available. Sessions will take place in the first floor Police Training Room. I will send out more information once exact details are confirmed. All sworn officers involved in Monday's incident and response are highly encouraged to attend. Arrangements will be made during your scheduled shift to allow for attendance. Civilian PD staff are also invited to take part.

On a personal note, words cannot adequately express how proud we are of the service you've done for this community. If you have questions in regards to the listed resources or wish to seek other available resources through our employee assistance programs, please don't hesitate to reach out to Emily, Aaron, Dr. Plazas or myself.

## SPC Vehicle Program Update

Staff recently held discussions with Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC) vehicle program vendors and was adviscd that the already blcak outlook for vehicle production is worscning. While some orders reccived in 2021 may still be scheduled for production, vehicle makers may either cancel the orders outright or decline to turn them over to be rescheduled. Additionally, most government vehicles that would normally be produced by Ford, Chevy and Dodge may not be produced for 2023 at all. Some industry analysts suggest that the best bet is to wait until 2024 as supply chain issues may not be fully resolved until then.

The SPC requested rollovers from General Motors on 2022 Chevrolet Tahoe Patrol Package (Contract \#185) and Silverado Regular Cab 1500 Work Truck (Contract \#186), but were informed that those vehicles will not be produced in 2022. In addition, the Chevrolet Bolt EV 5 Door Hatchback (Contract \#175) may not be produced for govermment and commercial orders.

Of the 600 SPC Ford Police Interceptor Utilities (Contract \#204) currently on order with Currie Motors, approximately 200 have been built. Ford Super Duty Trucks that have been on order since July 2021 may be cancelled by the manufacturer, who plans to release new specifications by the end of 2022 or early 2023. Finally, there will be limited production of 2023 Ford Transit Full Size Van, Passenger Wagon and E-Transit Vans (Contract \#207), with the chance that 2022 orders may also be canceled in the government and commercial sectors. Staff will continue to stay on top of this issue and will send additional information as events warrant. Staff contact: Ellen Dayan

There are 158 businesses within the perimeter; 22 are restaurants/food businesses. Restaurants/food businesses incurred significant losses because of spoilage. Some paid their employees; some could not. The loss of business has impacted retailers, but still, they can sell their inventory of merchandise.

I've suggested to the businesses I spoke with that they contact their property owners to request a rent reduction for the days they couldn't operate. I could email the property owners to suggest it, but from the pandemic, I know Tabani and a few others waited until businesses received PPP and required their tenants to pay their rent in full.

I'll ask some businesses if their insurance will cover these losses and at what $\%$, deductible... However, if they're covered, their premiums will increase - because that's what insurance companies do after a loss, and they'll be considered higher risk.

Both a grant program and a fund are needed to get our businesses back on track. I'd consider a grant program to cover $50 \%$ of food losses, but would need more information to make a recommendation.

Julie- Could finance assess the loss of revenue for each impacted business for one week based on their most recent quarterly sales taxes?

From what I am hearing personally, and seeing on social media, there is significant public support for our businesses, in and outside the community. There would have to be equitable distribution of funds to all the businesses, not just favorites. Timing is everything; setting up a fund for the public to contribute would have to be done quickly while there is worldwide attention.

Also, I know Walker Bros., Starbucks, Gearheads, and Bright Bowls sheltered people, but there may be others. Do we know all those businesses? It would be a grand gesture for the Mayor to contact those businesses and for the City to recognize them. Others outside the perimeter have also been very generous - they went beyond giving food prepared for an event that would have gone to waste. I don't know who they all are.

Separately, can you, Carolyn and Erin explore if there is an interest and feasibility to provide grants to the businesses who have been closed since Monday due to the impact of the shooting. How many businesses are in the hot zone? It's possible there will be public support for the employees who didn't earn wages; not sure if the property owners are providing relief; what insurance support looks like, etc. Does it make sense for the City to issue any grants to support our businesses? Thanks.

There are 158 businesses within the perimeter; 22 are restaurants/food businesses. Restaurants/food businesses incurred significant losses because of spoilage. Some paid their employees; some could not. The loss of business has impacted retailers, but still, they can sell their inventory of merchandise.

I've suggested to the businesses I spoke with that they contact their property owners to request a rent reduction for the days they couldn't operate. I could email the property owners to suggest it, but from the pandemic, I know Tabani and a few others waited until businesses received PPP and required their tenants to pay their rent in full.

I'll ask some businesses if their insurance will cover these losses and at what \%, deductible... However, if they're covered, their premiums will increase - because that's what insurance companies do after a loss, and they'll be considered higher risk.

Both a grant program and a fund are needed to get our businesses back on track. I'd consider a grant program to cover $50 \%$ of food losses, but would need more information to make a recommendation.

Julie- Could finance assess the loss of revenue for each impacted business for one week based on their most recent quarterly sales taxes?

From what I am hearing personally, and seeing on social media, there is significant public support for our businesses, in and outside the community. There would have to be equitable distribution of funds to all the businesses, not just favorites. Timing is everything; setting up a fund for the public to contribute would have to be done quickly while there is worldwide attention.

Also, I know Walker Bros., Starbucks, Gearheads, and Bright Bowls sheltered people, but there may be others. Do we know all those businesses? It would be a grand gesture for the Mayor to contact those businesses and for the City to recognize them. Others outside the perimeter have also been very generous - they went beyond giving food prepared for an event that would have gone to waste. I don't know who they all are.
