Resources for Highland Park

With the horrific attack on the Highland Park Independence Day Parade still fresh in our memory, and the area of the shooting still an active crime scene, our souls ache for the families of those murdered and all those impacted by the events of the day. The killer shattered what should have been a celebration of freedom, stole the lives of seven loving individuals, and forever changed the lives of countless others.

Our community is still processing the immensity of the crimes and the depth of our loss. At the same time, each of us are dealing with the tragedy in our own distinct way. I won't begin to suggest how anyone should work through their personal reactions, but I do want you to know that no one need feel alone as you deal with your feelings and emotions. Whether it's talking to family and friends, connecting with local support organizations, or reaching out to professionals for guidance and support, resources are available for you and your loved ones.

Thankfully, there are already many organizations mobilized to help the community in coping with this tragedy. My team has compiled a long list of resources for those seeking assistance, which I have shared below. (If you are aware of any others, please let us know.) I am also including information on opportunities to support the response efforts.

We can draw strength from our connections with each other, from our neighbors, and from our community. I know we will get through this awful time together. And I promise we will again celebrate all that makes Highland Park and our entire region special.

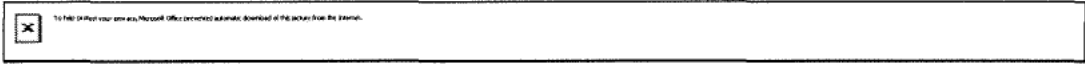

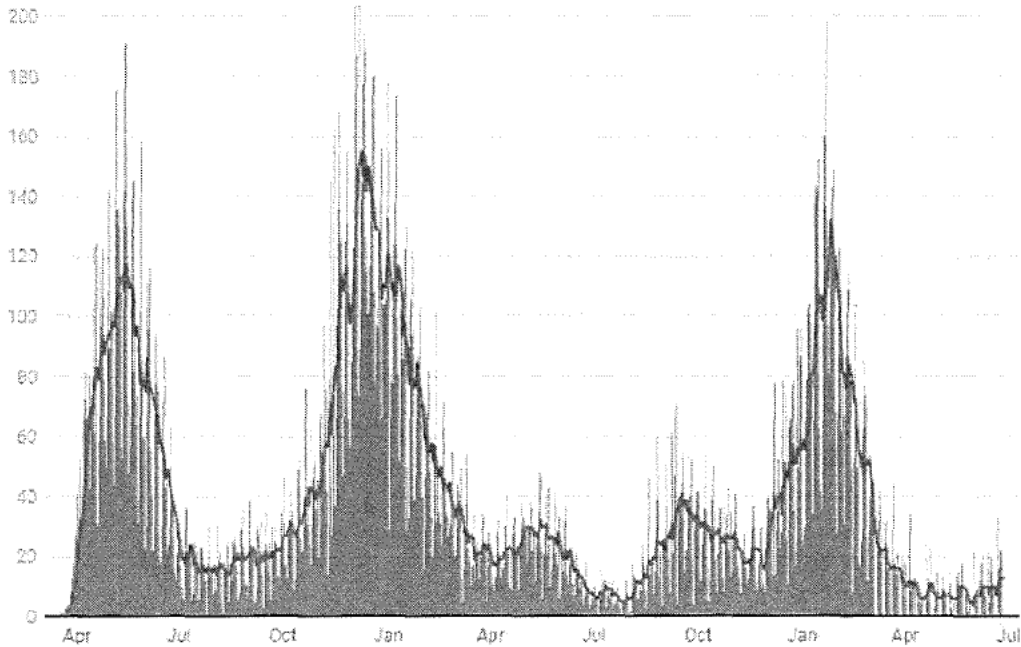

Welcome back to Disaster Discourse Monthly!

This month, we provide updates on extreme weather events; ongoing wildfires in the western United States (US); active shooter threats across the country; and the COVID-19 pandemic.

Extreme weather events impact regions around the US...

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) National Hurricane Center (NHC) declared that the first named storm of the Atlantic hurricane season formed on Sunday, June 5. The system brought nearly 15 inches of rain to South Florida on June 4, causing flash flooding and sewage overflows in areas near Miami. The storm officially earned its name, Alex, after strengthening to a tropical storm off Florida's east coast. Before entering the Gulf, the storm's heavy downpours caused landslides in western Cuba, killing three people and severing electricity to parts of the island. In its final report on the system, the NHC said Alex's winds extended up to 195 miles from the storm's center and sustained maximum winds near 60 miles per hour (mph). Tropical Storm Alex kicked off what forecasters predict to be the seventh

consecutive year of above-normal hurricane activity in the Atlantic basin, with 14 to 21 named storms considered likely. So far this year, there have been three named storms in the Atlantic. On Friday, July 2, Tropical Storm Bonnie made landfall in Nicaragua, and shortly thereafter, on Saturday, July 3, Tropical Storm Colin formed overnight off the coast of South Carolina. While Colin quickly lost organization, the system brought heavy rains and strong winds along portions of the Carolina coast with maximum sustained winds remaining near 40 miles per hour throughout Saturday.

In addition, historic heat waves prompted safety warnings for a vast portion of the US this month, shattering daily temperature records across the Southwest, Central Plains, and Midwest. The National Public Radio (NPR) noted that over 50 million people were under excessive heat advisories on June 11, as more than 25 major cities tied or broke record-high temperatures. Entergy, an energy company which provides power for 3 million customers throughout Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas, encountered levels of electricity usage surpassing 21,800 megawatts, exceeding the previous record established last summer. In Minneapolis, Minnesota, extreme heat conditions buckled the pavement of two highways, creating hazardous roadways for drivers. Meanwhile, at least 2,000 cattle died from intense heat stress in southwest Kansas over the weekend of June 11. The extreme heat noticeably increases the risk of heat-related illnesses, especially for those working or staying outdoors. The National Weather Service (NWS) cautions individuals to drink plenty of fluids, stay out of the sun, remain in air-conditioned rooms, and check on relatives and neighbors.

On Tuesday, June 14, Governor Greg Gianforte declared a statewide disaster in Montana after an unexpected atmospheric river produced extreme flash flooding in Yellowstone National Park. According to NOAA, atmospheric rivers are regions in the atmosphere that transport water vapor and generally release it as rain or snow once they reach land. The National Park Service (NPS) closed all entrances to the park after the Yellowstone River rose to an unprecedented level, surpassing its historical crest by more than two feet. More than 10,000 visitors were ordered to leave the park for their own safety, and about 100

people were airlifted to safety. Due to severe damage to roads, power lines, and other critical infrastructure, Yellowstone's north loop will remain closed for an indefinite amount of time.

Ongoing fires in the western US...

This month, extreme heat waves and critically dry conditions continued to increase the risk for wildfire activity across the US. According to the National Interagency Fire Center (NIFC), 53 large fires are currently active across nine states, burning more than 2 million acres. Alaska is experiencing the bulk of active fires, with 35 currently burning, while Arizona has five active fires and California and New Mexico are facing two. In its monthly seasonal outlook, the NIFC indicates the year-to-date total of acres burned within the US is approximately 112 percent above the 10-year average.

The Lime Complex, the largest fire burning in the US, currently spans over 782,000 acres of Southwest Alaska. According to InciWeb, the Lime Complex is a series of eight staffed and ten unstaffed lightning-caused wildfires encompassing an isolated geographic area accessible only by air and river. On Thursday, June 30, the Alaska Multi-Agency Coordination (MAC) Group elevated the state to Preparedness Level 5, the highest level identified in the Alaska Preparedness Plan. At this level, the majority of a state's wildland firefighting personnel and resources are committed to active wildfire incidents.

In addition, response teams continue to battle the Rices fire in northern California, where multiple evacuation orders have been issued for Yuba and Nevada County communities. According to Brian Estes, chief of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's (CAL FIRE) Nevada-Yuba Placer Unit, the fire began on Tuesday, June 28, in the area of Rices Crossing Road. Four structures were destroyed and over 500 others were threatened, including critical infrastructure such as water delivery and electrical systems. In its incident update on June 30, CAL FIRE reported seven firefighters have been

injured by the fire which has grown to 904 acres and sits at 12 percent containment.

Active shooter events across the country...

This month, numerous active shooter incidents affected communities across the country. On June 2, a gunman killed four people at a hospital in Tulsa, Oklahoma, before fatally shooting himself. According to Tulsa Police Chief Wendell Franklin, the shooter entered the facility carrying an AR-15-style rifle and a semi-automatic handgun with intent to target his doctor, whom he blamed for ongoing pain after recent back surgery. Among the victims were two doctors, including the targeted surgeon, an on-site receptionist, and a visitor to the clinic.

In Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Mayor Jim Kenney ordered a curfew in the nightlife district on June 5 after three were killed and 11 others were wounded in a mass shooting the night before. Authorities say the incident began as a physical altercation between three men that escalated with the draw of handguns. Within seconds of the initial gunshots, multiple other assailants began firing into crowds gathered nearby. Philadelphia Police currently have two people in custody and are searching for two more suspects in connection with the event.

In addition, three people were killed, and 14 others were injured after multiple shooters opened fire near a nightclub in Chattanooga, Tennessee, on June 5. City Police Chief Celeste Murphy said 14 of the victims were struck by bullets, and another three were struck by vehicles while trying to flee the area. Of the three fatalities, two were by gunshot wounds, and one was killed by a car. Police officials have made three arrests in relation to the shooting and continue to pursue more potential suspects.

In Smithsburg, Maryland, an employee at a manufacturing facility killed three

co-workers and injured another in a workplace shooting event on June 9. After fleeing the scene, the gunman initiated gunfire with a Maryland State Police trooper, leaving both injured and rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment. The shooter officially faces 25 charges, including three counts of first-degree murder.

Most recently, on Monday, July 4, a gunman opened fire during a community parade in Highland Park, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago, during their Independence Day Parade. Seven people were killed and more than 30 were wounded. The suspect is in custody.

On Saturday, June 25, President Biden signed the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act to bolster public safety and prevent gun violence tragedies before they occur. The legislation improves the review process of the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) and provides substantial investments in mental health services, school safety, and crisis intervention programs.

The COVID-19 pandemic and Monkeypox...

The US has reported that more than 87.6 million people have been infected with COVID-19; while over one million Americans have died from the virus. To date, over 83.2 percent of people over the age of five in the US have been vaccinated either partially or fully. Additionally, 47.8 percent of people who are vaccinated and eligible for a booster have gotten their booster shot. On Friday, June 17, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized the Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines for use in children as young as six months old.

In addition, there are now more than 300 confirmed Monkeypox cases in the US, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced an “enhanced

nationwide vaccination strategy” to reduce the spread of monkeypox on June 28, including efforts to expand vaccine availability in the coming weeks. Accordingly, we must continue to maintain heightened public health mitigation and preparedness measures through the coming summer months.

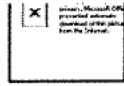

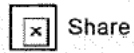

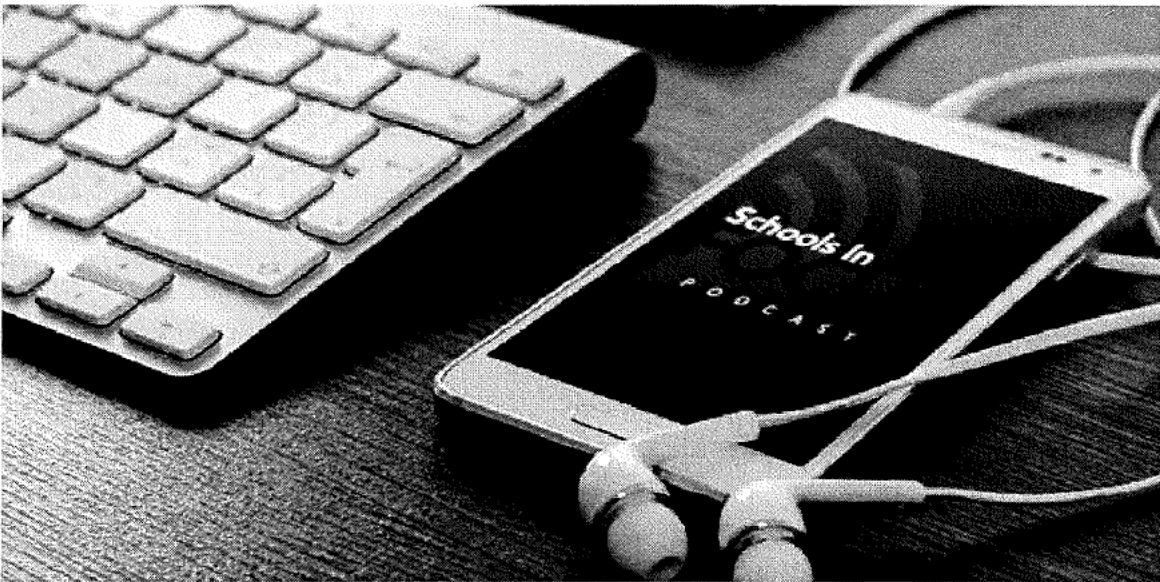

Although the innocence and happiness that is Highland Park was shattered by the deafening sound of automatic fire yesterday, our community is strong and I know we'll all get thru this.

During the parade yesterday, I was sitting with my family on Central, about 30 or 40 feet west of Second Street. Fortunately, my family escaped without harm, for which we are grateful.

In the chaos, like everyone around us, we evacuated the area leaving many of our personal items behind. My inquiry is minuscule in comparison to all of the efforts the city continues to deal with, but I wanted to reach out to inquire if there are any plans regarding retrieving the personal items left behind on Central. The items we left were mostly objects that are easily replaced, but we did have one item with us that has a personal importance to my family and if we can retrieve the item at some point, it would provide some needed resolve to a day that will be with us for the rest of our lives.

I of course understand the authorities are focused on their investigation and the last thing my family wants to do is impede the investigation in any way. I am simply reaching out to see if there is a plan or thought when or if we may have the opportunity to retrieve items left behind, if they are even still there?

Lastly, if there is anything I can do to be of assistance, please don't hesitate to ask. Highland Park is my home and if there is anything I can do to be of assistance, please let me know.

Welcome back to Disaster Discourse Monthly!

This month, we provide updates on extreme weather events; ongoing wildfires in the western United States (US); active shooter threats across the country; and the COVID-19 pandemic.

Extreme weather events impact regions around the US...

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) National Hurricane Center (NHC) declared that the first named storm of the Atlantic hurricane season formed on Sunday, June 5. The system brought nearly 15 inches of rain to South Florida on June 4, causing flash flooding and sewage overflows in areas near Miami. The storm officially earned its name, Alex, after strengthening to a tropical storm off Florida's east coast. Before entering the Gulf, the storm's heavy downpours caused landslides in western Cuba, killing three people and severing electricity to parts of the island. In its final report on the system, the NHC said Alex's winds extended up to 195 miles from the storm's center and sustained maximum winds near 60 miles per hour (mph). Tropical Storm Alex kicked off what forecasters predict to be the seventh

consecutive year of above-normal hurricane activity in the Atlantic basin, with 14 to 21 named storms considered likely. So far this year, there have been three named storms in the Atlantic. On Friday, July 2, Tropical Storm Bonnie made landfall in Nicaragua, and shortly thereafter, on Saturday, July 3, Tropical Storm Colin formed overnight off the coast of South Carolina. While Colin quickly lost organization, the system brought heavy rains and strong winds along portions of the Carolina coast with maximum sustained winds remaining near 40 miles per hour throughout Saturday.

In addition, historic heat waves prompted safety warnings for a vast portion of the US this month, shattering daily temperature records across the Southwest, Central Plains, and Midwest. The National Public Radio (NPR) noted that over 50 million people were under excessive heat advisories on June 11, as more than 25 major cities tied or broke record-high temperatures. Entergy, an energy company which provides power for 3 million customers throughout Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas, encountered levels of electricity usage surpassing 21,800 megawatts, exceeding the previous record established last summer. In Minneapolis, Minnesota, extreme heat conditions buckled the pavement of two highways, creating hazardous roadways for drivers. Meanwhile, at least 2,000 cattle died from intense heat stress in southwest Kansas over the weekend of June 11. The extreme heat noticeably increases the risk of heat-related illnesses, especially for those working or staying outdoors. The National Weather Service (NWS) cautions individuals to drink plenty of fluids, stay out of the sun, remain in air-conditioned rooms, and check on relatives and neighbors.

On Tuesday, June 14, Governor Greg Gianforte declared a statewide disaster in Montana after an unexpected atmospheric river produced extreme flash flooding in Yellowstone National Park. According to NOAA, atmospheric rivers are regions in the atmosphere that transport water vapor and generally release it as rain or snow once they reach land. The National Park Service (NPS) closed all entrances to the park after the Yellowstone River rose to an unprecedented level, surpassing its historical crest by more than two feet. More than 10,000 visitors were ordered to leave the park for their own safety, and about 100

people were airlifted to safety. Due to severe damage to roads, power lines, and other critical infrastructure, Yellowstone's north loop will remain closed for an indefinite amount of time.

Ongoing fires in the western US...

This month, extreme heat waves and critically dry conditions continued to increase the risk for wildfire activity across the US. According to the National Interagency Fire Center (NIFC), 53 large fires are currently active across nine states, burning more than 2 million acres. Alaska is experiencing the bulk of active fires, with 35 currently burning, while Arizona has five active fires and California and New Mexico are facing two. In its monthly seasonal outlook, the NIFC indicates the year-to-date total of acres burned within the US is approximately 112 percent above the 10-year average.

The Lime Complex, the largest fire burning in the US, currently spans over 782,000 acres of Southwest Alaska. According to InciWeb, the Lime Complex is a series of eight staffed and ten unstaffed lightning-caused wildfires encompassing an isolated geographic area accessible only by air and river. On Thursday, June 30, the Alaska Multi-Agency Coordination (MAC) Group elevated the state to Preparedness Level 5, the highest level identified in the Alaska Preparedness Plan. At this level, the majority of a state's wildland firefighting personnel and resources are committed to active wildfire incidents.

In addition, response teams continue to battle the Rices fire in northern California, where multiple evacuation orders have been issued for Yuba and Nevada County communities. According to Brian Estes, chief of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's (CAL FIRE) Nevada-Yuba Placer Unit, the fire began on Tuesday, June 28, in the area of Rices Crossing Road. Four structures were destroyed and over 500 others were threatened, including critical infrastructure such as water delivery and electrical systems. In its incident update on June 30, CAL FIRE reported seven firefighters have been

injured by the fire which has grown to 904 acres and sits at 12 percent containment.

Active shooter events across the country...

This month, numerous active shooter incidents affected communities across the country. On June 2, a gunman killed four people at a hospital in Tulsa, Oklahoma, before fatally shooting himself. According to Tulsa Police Chief Wendell Franklin, the shooter entered the facility carrying an AR-15-style rifle and a semi-automatic handgun with intent to target his doctor, whom he blamed for ongoing pain after recent back surgery. Among the victims were two doctors, including the targeted surgeon, an on-site receptionist, and a visitor to the clinic.

In Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Mayor Jim Kenney ordered a curfew in the nightlife district on June 5 after three were killed and 11 others were wounded in a mass shooting the night before. Authorities say the incident began as a physical altercation between three men that escalated with the draw of handguns. Within seconds of the initial gunshots, multiple other assailants began firing into crowds gathered nearby. Philadelphia Police currently have two people in custody and are searching for two more suspects in connection with the event.

In addition, three people were killed, and 14 others were injured after multiple shooters opened fire near a nightclub in Chattanooga, Tennessee, on June 5. City Police Chief Celeste Murphy said 14 of the victims were struck by bullets, and another three were struck by vehicles while trying to flee the area. Of the three fatalities, two were by gunshot wounds, and one was killed by a car. Police officials have made three arrests in relation to the shooting and continue to pursue more potential suspects.

In Smithsburg, Maryland, an employee at a manufacturing facility killed three

co-workers and injured another in a workplace shooting event on June 9. After fleeing the scene, the gunman initiated gunfire with a Maryland State Police trooper, leaving both injured and rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment. The shooter officially faces 25 charges, including three counts of first-degree murder.

Most recently, on Monday, July 4, a gunman opened fire during a community parade in Highland Park, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago, during their Independence Day Parade. Seven people were killed and more than 30 were wounded. The suspect is in custody.

On Saturday, June 25, President Biden signed the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act to bolster public safety and prevent gun violence tragedies before they occur. The legislation improves the review process of the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) and provides substantial investments in mental health services, school safety, and crisis intervention programs.

The COVID-19 pandemic and Monkeypox...

The US has reported that more than 87.6 million people have been infected with COVID-19; while over one million Americans have died from the virus. To date, over 83.2 percent of people over the age of five in the US have been vaccinated either partially or fully. Additionally, 47.8 percent of people who are vaccinated and eligible for a booster have gotten their booster shot. On Friday, June 17, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized the Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines for use in children as young as six months old.

In addition, there are now more than 300 confirmed Monkeypox cases in the US, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced an “enhanced

nationwide vaccination strategy” to reduce the spread of monkeypox on June 28, including efforts to expand vaccine availability in the coming weeks. Accordingly, we must continue to maintain heightened public health mitigation and preparedness measures through the coming summer months.

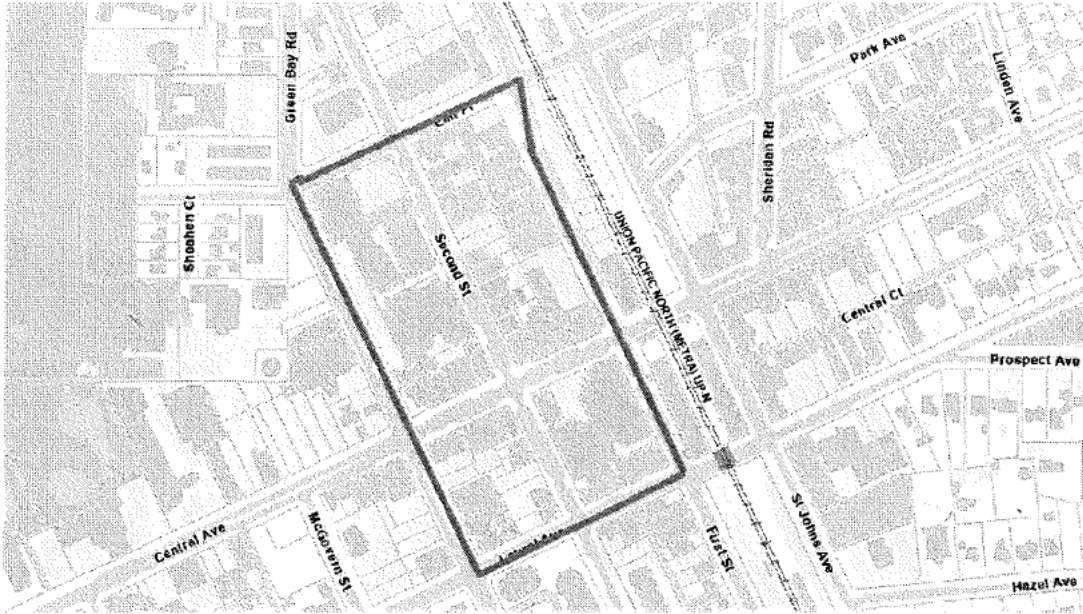
The City of Highland Park is heartbroken by the tragic shooting at the Independence Day Parade on July 4, 2022. As a community, we all share in grieving those who were killed or injured, and our hearts are with their loved ones. Since this unimaginable attack, Highland Park's businesses have stood in solidarity with the victims, survivors, their loved ones, and our community as a whole.

The City understands that the past few days have been especially challenging for business owners and employees, particularly those within the investigation area. While we can all acknowledge that the nature of this incident necessitates a thorough investigation that requires the preservation, as much as possible, of the crime scene, we also know that this has caused additional hardships in addition to the trauma we all experienced just a few days ago. We have prepared the below FAQ to share as much information as we can about this situation, help you to set timeline expectations for your employees, suppliers, and customers, and connect you with resources and assistance to best serve your customers and support your teams.

When can businesses reopen?

We know this situation is difficult for our local businesses and we appreciate your patience.

The FBI and Lake County Major Crimes Unit are investigating a major crime. They must be thorough. The area will reopen as soon as we receive clearance from them. They anticipate allowing businesses within the perimeter to access their place of business by Monday, July 11, but this is tentative. Access to your business does not mean you can open for business. As the scene is processed and evaluated, we will provide more information. The City will provide another update to businesses no later than Friday, July 8. The perimeter map follows below



How do healthcare professionals contact their patients to let them know their office is closed until further notice?

While the FBI and Lake County Major Crimes Unit are investigating a major crime, you cannot enter any building within the investigation perimeter. If you cannot access your patient/client list remotely, please consider changing your voicemail message to inform callers that you are closed due to a local emergency and to leave their names and phone numbers so that you can call them back to reschedule. You can also provide an alternate phone number for them to call you or your staff.

How do I get my mail during the closure?

Due to the recent events, the Postal service cannot deliver to the closed area due to the ongoing investigation. The Post Office currently has these deliveries on hold at the office. If any business affected by the investigation chooses to pick their mail up at the post office, they can do so during regular business hours. The post office will resume delivery once the authorities allow the Postal service access. Once this occurs, the postal service will deliver any mail currently on hold.

Will businesses receive any government funding to help them recoup lost revenue during the time they are unable to open? Will employees be compensated for lost wages?

No state or federal aid is available at this time. The City is researching opportunities for business assistance.

Are there counseling services available for the community beyond the next few days?

What can businesses do to support those that are working and the Highland Park community? Can we drop off food?

We are truly humbled by the incredible outpouring of support and generosity of the community.

We urge those who wish to show their financial support to send donations to the Highland Park Community Foundation; a longtime local organization deeply embedded in the community which is in the best position to help our neighbors in need. They have set up a fund to directly assist victims, survivors, and those that support them. Visit hpcf.org to submit donations.

If you or your business are interested in donating food or items to first responders, please contact hr@cityhpil.com with your contact information. We are keeping a list and will reach out should ongoing needs arise.

At this point in time please do not send food directly to any City locations in order to minimize duplicate donations.

Whom do we contact to volunteer to help those in need?

Immediate needs are being met through local, state, and national resources. The Volunteer Pool of Highland Park is maintaining a list of volunteers as a resource. Should there be a need for volunteers in the future. Individuals interested in having their contact information on file with the Volunteer Pool of Highland Park may email info@volunteerpoolhp.org with their name, contact information and any specific areas of expertise.

Organizations with a need for volunteers may reach out to the Volunteer Pool who will assist them in connecting with volunteers.

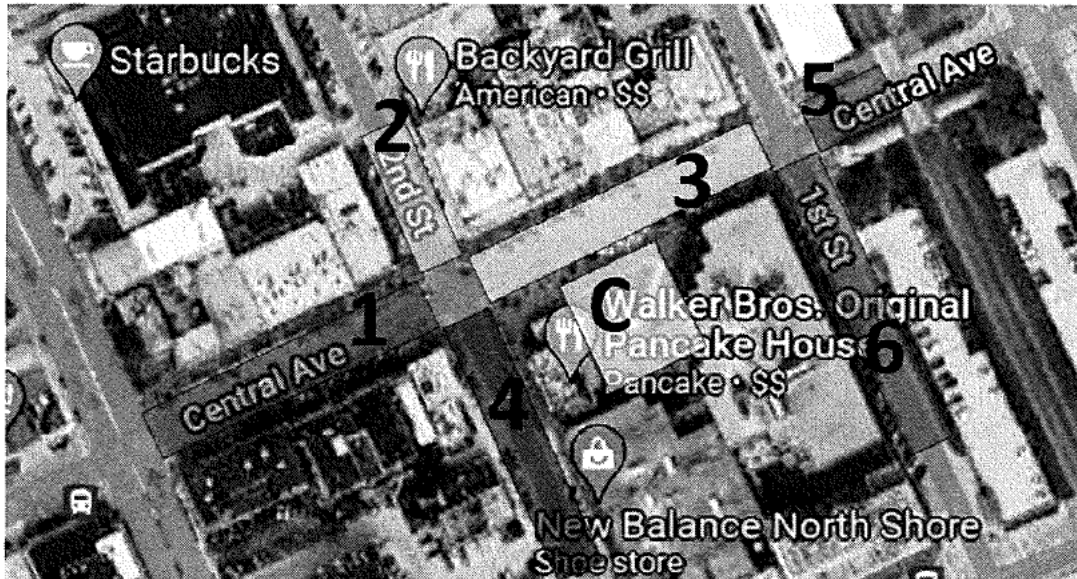
Should additional information become available or volunteer needs arise we will share any relevant information on the City's website at cityhpil.com.

Where should businesses take belongings that were left along the parade route?

Please do not remove personal property left along the parade route. Public Works will pick up items left along the parade route outside the secure area and place them on the lawn North of City Hall, 1707 St. Johns Avenue. Items may be picked up beginning at Noon on Thursday, July 7.

Property within the secure area is being processed by the FBI to ensure that all relevant evidence is gathered. Items that are not being retained for evidence will be released as they are processed and may be picked up at Highland Park High School, 433 Vine Ave, Highland Park from 9:00 AM through 9:00 PM until Friday. Future dates and hours for item pick-up will be shared as it becomes available.

Items recovered from zones 1 and 5 and limited items from zones 4 and 6 on the map below are available for pick-up at this time. There were no personal items recovered in area 2. Items from zone 3 as well as items in the intersection of 2nd and Central are not available for pick-up.






We thank all affected individuals for their patience during this lengthy process as this may take a significant amount of time. Additional information regarding the return of personal effects at the scene will be shared as it becomes available.

What should restaurants do with their spoiled food?

Lakeshore Recycling Systems is prepared to do a pickup of trash and dumpsters the day after businesses regain access to clear any rotting food from the business district. We will work with businesses on any additional assistance needed at that time.

What is the status of City-sponsored events?

We have temporarily paused City-sponsored community events for this week and next and anticipate resuming regular programming the week of July 17. We appreciate your understanding as our resources are heavily focused on the investigation. We are not canceling due to fear; we are focusing our resources on the investigation.

We give thanks for first responders, who ran toward gunfire, rather than away; who dropped everything to save the wounded and comfort survivors.

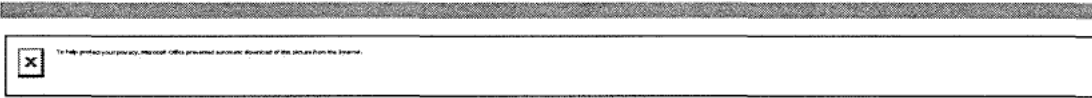

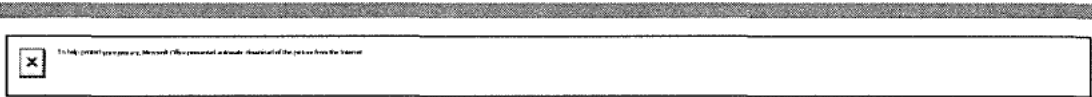


Volunteers Needed for Summer

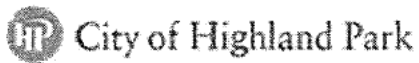
We had to do some research on our end and ask our counsel about the statute of limitations for things in collections. This is the response received from our corporate counsel.
