




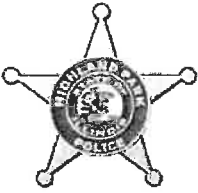

On November 29, 2016, I Detective Bodden conducted tobacco compliance checks using a 16 year old female agent, see Highland Park case #16-20441J for operational guidelines followed during the checks of licensed tobacco retailers.

At approximately 6:51pm, the agent successfully purchased a pack of Newport cigarettes from Bob's Pantry located at 55 St Johns Ave. I witnessed the transaction, and observed the store clerk, later identified as Joshua Phillips, take the agent's vertically printed State of Illinois Drivers License before the sale and appear to examine it. Mr Phillips proceeded to complete the sale of the cigarettes. I walked out behind the agent, retrieved the change from the transaction and the pack of cigarettes and proceeded back into the store. The agent obtained a receipt from the transaction and the agent had recorded the \$20 dollar bill in her possession in the event she was sold tobacco and no other funds pursuant to operational directives.

I announced my office to Mr Phillips and advised him that he had sold to a person under the age of 18. He stated that he looked at the Identification and thought that she was of age. There was a Tobacco sign posted behind the counter.

Mr Phillips retrieved the marked \$20 dollar bill from his register and returned it to me. I notified Dispatch of the incident and obtained the report number.

Mr Phillips was cited for Sale of tobacco to a minor, Highland Park Municipal Code 125.007(A), citation #018308, to appear in Administrative Court on December 15, 2016 at 1:30 pm.

A picture of the cigarettes was entered into digital evidence.

Mr Phillips has no prior sales of alcohol or tobacco to underage/ minors.

On October 7, 2015 I Detective Bodden and Detective Rash conducted Alcohol Compliance checks with a 19 year old male agent. See report #15-17954 outlines operational guidelines followed during the checks.

At approximately 1:25 pm the agent entered the front entrance of Bob's Pantry. The location is a current liquor license holder and sells alcohol in the self serve area that has both alcoholic and non alcoholic beverages. We visually monitored the agent during the transaction.

The agent exited the front doors carrying one 12 ounce bottle of Mikes Hard Lemonade and provided me with the change from the transaction.

The agent relayed that the female clerk checked his vertically issued State Identification card and appeared to have a difficult time calculating his date of birth.

I entered the business, identified myself to the clerk, who was later identified as Megdelina Martinez, who sold the alcohol to the agent.

Megdelina admitted to selling the agent the bottle of alcohol and checking the State identification. She stated that the Identification Card did have a date of birth of 1996 on it and that she had a hard time calculating the date of birth.

Megdelina was issued an Administrative Citation (#017442) for Sale of Alcohol to a Minor and is scheduled to appear in Admin Court on November 19, 2015 at 1:30 pm.

I photographed the change from the marked \$10.00 bill, and the bottle of alcohol and entered the photos into digital evidence. Megdelina retrieved the marked \$10.00 use bill from the register after I returned the change.

Bob's Pantry had the following Liquor Violations:

January 5, 2012 - #12-00215 - Sales of Liquor to a Minor

October 4, 2013 - #13-12365 - Sales of Liquor to a Minor

On December 7, 2015 Detective Hernandez delivered Liquor Commission Hearing notice to Magdalena Martinez at Bob's Pantry, located at 55 St Johns Ave. Proof of service was returned to Rob Sabo.

Later in the evening, I spoke with Owner, Bob Crimo and he informed me that he received the hearing notice.

On December 14, 2015 I appeared in front of the Highland Park Liquor Control Commission for Bob's Pantry.

Bob's Pantry was ordered a 6 month liquor license revocation for the sales of alcohol on premises. Liquor is to be removed from the shelves and not visible to the public. Coolers that housed alcohol are to be secured at all times. If Bob's Pantry paid outstanding fines from prior violations within 90 days the Liquor License would be revoked for 3 months (90 days).

If another violation occurred within one year, the Liquor License will be permanently revoked.

Friday January 15, 2015:

On the above listed date at approximately 3:00 PM, Det. Neuman and Det. Gallagher did an unannounced alcohol compliance check at Bob's Pantry (55 St. John's Ave, Highland Park). No alcoholic beverages were displayed for sale. A hand written sign was displayed on the refrigerator case explaining why there was no alcohol available. The note stated the following: "Due to a failed compliance check by our beloved Police Dept., We have been "Suspended" from selling beer & wine until March 15th, 2016. Please accept our deepest apologies during this time of mourning. Thank you in advance for understanding BoB".

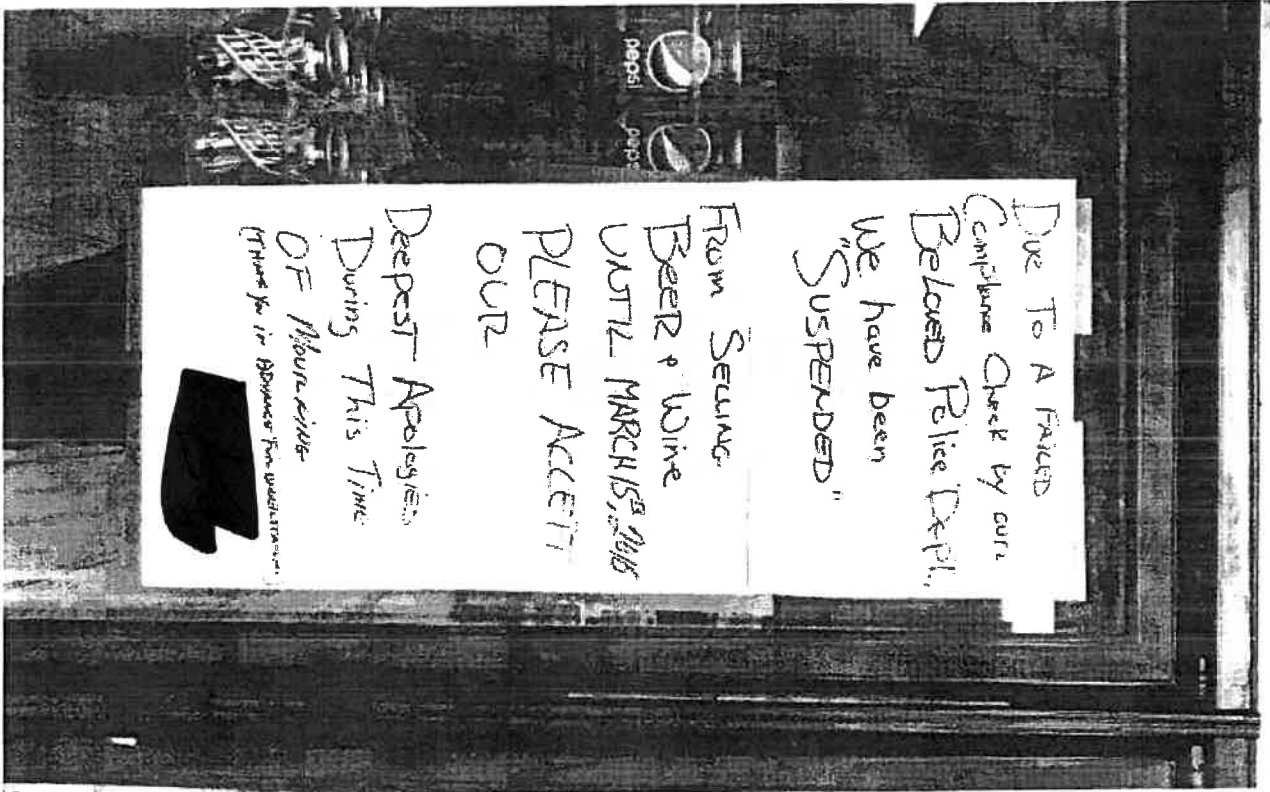

On August 30, 2013, at approximately 2306 hours I was dispatched to Bob's Pantry for the report of a man down, unresponsive, not breathing. I was right around the corner at the time and arrived approximately 1-2 minutes later.

I arrived on scene to find a man (later identified as [REDACTED] M/W) face down on the ground in front of the store with several bystanders around him including [REDACTED] F/W, and their friends [REDACTED]

I had car 94's jump bag with me. The victim was rolled onto his back. I assessed the man's responsiveness using a sternal rub and found him unresponsive to pain. I checked his Carotid pulse and found him pulse less. I did not observe any chest rise, nor did I hear or feel any air movement coming from the man. I pulled his shirt up to expose his chest. Deerfield Sergeant Mazariegos arrived on scene from his Ravinia post and began chest compressions while I turned on HPPD AED C94 and attached the pads to his chest (Adult Pads: Lot #10322-0954 Exp: 2013-09). Once attached, I instructed Sergeant Mazariegos to stop compressions and cleared the patient making sure no one was touching him while the AED analyzed the rhythm. The AED instructed "Shock Advised". I cleared the patient again, visually checking to make sure no one was touching him and verbally instructed bystanders to back up. I delivered 1 shock, then had Sergeant Mazariegos begin compressions again. At this point HPFD arrived and took over care. HPFD transported the patient to Highland Park Hospital.

[REDACTED] were given public assists to the hospital. I met them in the emergency waiting room. ER staff report [REDACTED] regained consciousness in the ambulance en-route to the hospital and was being treated by [REDACTED] and referred to [REDACTED]. I spoke with [REDACTED] who had no recollection of the event.

C94's AED was taken out of service for replacement pads. AED incident report completed and turned in with report.

On 06/21/13 at 6:49a. I was dispatched to the listed location, Bob's Pantry, to speak with listed complainant, Mark Miller, about an incident that occurred between him and listed person, Robert Weil.

Miller stated that at approx. 6a. he was in the store at the same time as Weil and that he joked with Weil about parking a car in Weil's driveway for Ravinia. Miller stated Weil then became very upset and began yelling and swearing at him which culminated in Weil standing with a coffee pot in his hand with coffee in it and stating he was going to throw the coffee on him. Weil then left the store.

Miller stated he talked to a friend of his who suggested he call police so approx. 49 minutes later he did so and related the above events. Miller stated his relationship with Weil is only that they are patrons of the same coffee shop and have never had any social interaction other than at the business.

I asked Miller if he wished to sign complaints against Weil and after much consideration stated he did. I then went to my car and retrieved a written statement form and returned to the store at which time Miller stated he does a lot of business with people in town and asked if his name would be in the paper and I stated the incident is public record and that I have no control over what is in the paper. Miller then asked if he could think about it and I advised in order to maintain his credibility to his state of mind, which is an important element of this crime, at the time of the incident and reasons for going forward he would need to decide now. He then stated he did not wish to press charges and asked if I could speak with Weil about the incident and I stated I would.

I then went to Weil's residence and he related the following. Weil confirmed he has known Miller for several years and only from the store. Weil stated Miller has asked him several times in the past if he or friends of his can park in Weil's drive and walk to Ravinia since Weil lives across the street from the north Opus priority lot. Weil has always denied permission and feels Miller is frustrated about not being allowed and refuses to accept Weil's denial and is getting more aggressive in his requests.

On the morning in question Weil states Miller stood in his personal space and again asked to park in his drive way for Ravinia. Weil again denied and Miller continued to stand very near him following him around the store. Weil states he repeatedly asked Miller to stop talking to him and not stand so close to him at which time Miller asked Weil sarcastically if he needed to take more psych "medicine". Weil states he was attempting to get away from Miller when he went to get his coffee and that Miller pursued him and continued to stand very near him. Miller stated he felt intimidated and threatened by Miller's proximity at which time he told Miller if he did not back away from him he would throw the coffee on him. Miller then stated "go ahead" and Weil then stated to Miller he would never do that. Weil then left the store.

I then advised Weil that Miller did not want this incident investigated further but that it would be good if he was going to continue to frequent the store when Miller is there that he should not talk to him and that I would be making the same request to Miller. Weil agreed.

I then contacted Miller and advised him of what Weil stated and that in the future if someone asks to be left alone that he should honor that request. I also advised Miller that Weil agreed not to talk to him in the future and Miller agreed to the same.

On 06/27/13 I retrieved a voicemail from Miller, which he left on 06/26/13, stating on 06/24/13 Weil had spoken to him against my "order" at the store. Miller then responded to the station on 06/26/13 and related the following. On 06/24/13 Weil had gone against my "order" that he was not to speak to Miller and that he should have repercussions for doing so. Miller was advised that I do not have the authority to "order" people not to speak to someone and that there was nothing I could do about it. Miller then stated he was threatened and that Weil stated he was going to "get him" for contacting the police about the previous incident. I advised Miller that statement, although regrettable, was not criminal in nature due to its ambiguity and that it could mean several different things. I advised Miller, as I did previously on 06/24, the elements of assault and that the interaction between the two on the 24th did not meet the requirements. Miller stated he understood and agreed but that he had spoken with a friend and decided he wished Weil to be charged for the 06/24 incident. I advised Miller he had already declined to press charges concerning that incident and that his state of mind the day of the 24th had not changed due to what ever his friend had told him or his interaction with Weil on the 26th. Miller then stated I was not taking the incident seriously and that he wanted a second opinion from a different Officer. I advised him that I could not take this incident more seriously than offering him a full investigation and the opportunity to sign complaints which he declined and that it is not procedure to get a second opinion. He then asked to speak to my supervisor and he confirmed it was not because he was dissatisfied with my handling of the case but because he wanted a second opinion.

Miller then spoke with Sgt. Lowman and advised him of the above. Sgt. Lowman gave Miller another opportunity to complete a witness statement and Miller still was not committed to Weil being charged. Sgt. Lowman then advised Miller he could take the witness statement with him and if he did decide to sign complaints he could drop it off at the station on my next duty day, which was 07/01, and that the case would be subsequently reviewed by the city attorney for possible charges.

I then phoned Weil and advised him the investigation had been reopened and the opportunity allotted Miller by Sgt. Lowman. I asked Weil if he wished to come to the station and make an official voluntary statement concerning the two incidents and he did.

At the psc I read Weil his Miranda warning which he stated he understood and signed.

Weil stated concerning his interaction with Miller on the 24th that he highly regretted it and that he attempted to apologize to Miller for talking to him. I asked Weil what he meant when he said he was going to "get" Miller and Weil stated he told Miller he was

going to get him a "cops and robbers toy for Hanukkah since you like to play police so much". Weil stated he never said simply "I'm going to get you". Weil then reiterated what he had told me on the 21st about their interaction on that day. Weil stated he has never had any intention of harming Miller. Weil states he gets frustrated with Miller due to him entering his personal space when he speaks. Weil stated he never intended to throw coffee on Miller and that he thinks Miller believes the same due to Miller stating "go ahead" when Weil threatened him if he wouldn't back up.

I then gave Weil a voluntary statement form to take with him and return to me on 07/01 if he wished.

On 07/01/13 during my shift neither Miller nor Weil responded to the psc with their respective statements.

On 07/06/13 I found an envelope in the platoon basket with Miller's written statement. He also left a written note from Paul Crimo, Bob's Pantry employee, and a copy of an email from "Robert Kaplan" giving statements concerning the 06/21 incident. Miller did not answer his phone so I left a message asking him to contact me concerning the other two statements and their validity.

I will request an official written statement from Crimo in the near future.

OfficerID: Mflaig, Narrative Supplement

On 07/11/13 I went to Bob's pantry and spoke with listed witness, Paul Crimo, who stated he did not wish to complete an official witness statement. Weil, who happened to be in the store, then came to us to ask what the city attorney had decided at which time I informed him the investigation was not complete and the case had not yet been submitted. I then advised him I was at the store to request an official written statement from Crimo at which time Crimo stated he would make a written statement.

I then advised Miller that the copy of the email he submitted from listed witness, Robert Kaplan, was not acceptable due to its lack of foundation. Miller then stated Kaplan was in the store and summoned him to us. I then asked if he wanted to make a written statement concerning Miller and Weil's first interaction and he stated he did. We then went outside and Kaplan stated the following.

Kaplan stated he first heard Weil swearing in a loud voice that he hated Miller. Weil would settle down for sometime then swear at Miller again at which time Kaplan states he asked Miller to stop swearing. Weil then apologized to Kaplan for swearing and again settled down but started swearing again at Miller stating he was going to throw the coffee on him. Kaplan states he told him again to stop swearing and again Weil apologized to Kaplan. Kaplan states Weil then became angry because he could not find his paper then left. Kaplan stated he did not hear Weil asking Miller to stay away from him. He only heard Weil calling Miller an "asshole" and saying that nobody likes him.

I then gave Kaplan a written statement form to complete and return to me at a later time and he returned to the store with Miller.

I then asked Crimo what he observed and he stated Weil "went off" on Miller and that he threatened to pour coffee on him. Crimo stated Weil did ask Miller several times to stay away from him, that he did not like him, and to just leave him alone and that Miller continued to engage Weil until Weil left the store.

Written statement form also left with Crimo.

Case to be reviewed by City Attorney's office after both completed written statements are returned.

On 07/19/13 I received an email from city attorney, Jody Gingiss, who stated charges would not be filed in this case. Gingiss stated the elements of the crime were not met, that Miller was the aggressor in this incident, and that Miller's actions after the incident bring his fear of Weil and Miller's credibility into question.

Both Mr. Weil and Mr. Miller were advised.

On Thursday January 5, 2012 at 4:15 pm Detective Evans and I were conducting an alcohol compliance check at Bob's Pantry and Deli (55 St. Johns Ave) utilizing a 20 year old special agent. The special agent was dropped off outside the location and we watched as he entered the establishment. We parked our unmarked squad on the public street in front of the establishment. We observed the special agent walk to the alcoholic beverage section and retrieve an item and walk to the checkout line. We observed a M/W employee complete the sale of the alcohol and the special agent walked out of the establishment towards our unmarked squad and entered.

Once inside the special agent stated that the M/W employee asked for his ID and looked at it, looked at him, handed him the ID back and completed the sale of the alcohol. The special agent paid with a \$20 bill, that was photographed earlier, and he received one \$5 dollar bill, three \$1 dollar bills, and a nickel in return. The special agent advised us that he retrieved a six pack of "312 Urban Wheat Ale Goose Island Chicago beer" and that was what the employee had completed the sale for. The special agent turned over the six pack of "312 Urban Wheat Ale Goose Island Chicago beer" and the change (\$8.05) that he received to me. Detective Evans and I went inside the establishment to speak with the employee.

We met and spoke with Joshua Phillips at the counter. We asked him if he had just sold the six pack of "312 Urban Wheat Ale Goose Island Chicago beer" we were holding to a young man and he stated "Yes". We asked him if he checked the ID of the young man and he stated "Yes" We asked him if he realized that the young man was only 20 years old and he remained quiet. After a pause he stated that he thought the young man was 21 years old. We asked him if he asked the young man his age and he stated "No". We advised him that we were conducting alcohol compliance checks on several businesses in Highland Park including that one. We advised him that he would be cited for sale of alcohol to a minor and assigned a court date. He stated he would contact his boss and let him know. I issued J. Phillips administrative citation HP 014730 for Sale of alcohol to Minor 119.525 with a court date of February 16, 2012, 900am at Highland Park City Hall, 1707 St. Johns Ave. Highland Park, IL. 60035. Photographs were taken of the alcohol (six pack of "312 Urban Wheat Ale Goose Island Chicago beer") that was purchased. The special agent was subpoenaed to the court date and he also completed a witness statement to include in the case.

On this date, I served the Notice of Hearing to Paul Crimo at Bob's Pantry for Bob Crimo to appear before the liquor commission.

OfficerID: Sgallagher, Narrative Supplement

On 04-20-12 at 3:37pm along with Detective Fishman I responded to 55 St. Johns Ave. Bob's Pantry and met with owner Robert Crimo. I provided Crimo with findings and order from the liquor control commission. I then went over the order with Crimo and asked him if he had any questions. Crimo related that he had locks already installed on the cooler and agreed to removed the liquor and lock the cooler doors as required. I further advised Crimo that he was not able to sell alcohol for 14 days starting on today's date. Crimo stated that he understood all of the findings and had no further questions.

On 7/4/11, at approximately 10:05 am, I responded to the above location reference a Public Accident, where the victim fell off his bicycle. Prior to my arrival, I heard over the radio that the fire department was transporting the victim to Highland Park Hospital. When I arrived to the accident scene, I observed a male subject sitting on the sidewalk next to two bicycles. I spoke to the subject who identified himself as [REDACTED]. I asked him what happened and he stated his friend, [REDACTED] was riding in the front of their pack of approximately 8 riders and he looked back to check which direction they would proceed in. He hit a "divot" in the roadway and fell off his bike. I asked him if he saw the accident and he related he saw him fall down, but was told by another rider that he looked back. [REDACTED] explained that his wife was on the way to pick him and both bicycles up.

I looked at the roadway and observed a sunken area of roadway that created a pothole. The pothole was located in front of 57 St. Johns Ave on the west side of the southbound lane. It measured approximately 1 foot 5 inches across east to west and 2 feet across north to south. It was 82 feet south of the manhole across from 75 St Johns address and 4 feet east of the west curbline. The deepest part of the manhole measured approximately 2 inches. I looked at [REDACTED] bike which was a white and orange Trek CLV2 Carbon road bike. The serial number on the bottom of the frame read WTU024T225G. The chain was intact on the gear sprocket and I observed scratches to the left handle bar, left side of the seat and along the left side of the pedals. I photographed the roadway and the bike.

[REDACTED] arrived on scene and they took custody of [REDACTED] bike. I responded to the hospital and observed two other males dressed in cycling gear standing outside the hospital with [REDACTED]. I asked them if they saw the accident involving [REDACTED] and they said yes. They were identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] related he was riding second rider behind [REDACTED] and they were southbound on St Johns Ave approaching Lake Cook Rd, going approximately 15 MPH. [REDACTED] looked back over his shoulder while holding his handle bars with only one hand. He hit the pothole in the roadway and lost control of his bike and fell off. [REDACTED] related he observed the same as he was riding third rider behind [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

I entered the hospital and met with [REDACTED] in a room in the emergency department. [REDACTED] had abrasions to his left arm and was complaining of left hip pain. I asked him what happened and he related a similar account as everyone else. He stated he was riding first in their group and looked back to verify which direction they were going to continue in. He stated he held the handle bars with his left hand only and looked back over his left shoulder. [REDACTED] hit the pothole in the roadway and lost control falling down onto his left side. I photographed his injuries to his arm. I asked him if he had abrasions anywhere else and he said no. I observed an older scabbed over abrasion to his left knee and he stated it was a previous injury. [REDACTED] was being treated by [REDACTED].

I completed the city insurance form.

[REDACTED] related [REDACTED] had surgery on his pelvis and was at a rehabilitation center in Glenview.

She stated [REDACTED] was recovering from his injuries and if I wanted to call her she could tell me what happened.
