On 04 October 2013 I conducted alcohol compliance checks with an 19 year old agent. Case 2013-12360 outlines the operational guidelines followed during the checks.

At approximately 04:44 PM the agent entered Bob's Pantry & Deli, 55 St. Johns Avenue. The location is a current class S-2 liquor license holder, number 144-13, and operates as a convenience store and deli. Most of the alcohol at the location is in self-service coolers at the rear of the store. The agent entered the location at approximately 04:44 PM via the front door and proceeded to the rear coolers where he retrieved a six pack of Miller Lite 12 oz. bottles. Because of my familiarity with the location and its staff from previous incidents, I remained outside the store in a position where I could monitor the agent and his movements through the store's large front glass windows.

I observed the agent at the front checkout area for a period of time and observed a female clerk at the register. A male clerk come over and appeared to converse with the female attendant who completed the sale. The agent exited the store carrying a brown paper bag that contained the aforementioned sealed six pack of Miller Lite 12 oz. bottles. The agent was provided a receipt which showed a sale price of \$7.64 at 04:45 PM and provided me the change from the \$20 recorded bill that was used in the operation. I photographed the sealed bottles of Miller Lite and obtained the change from the agent.

The agent stated the female clerk did ask for his identification, studied it for awhile, and then called for assistance from a male employee. The agent stated the male clerk then asked for his identification again which he produced and the male and female employees then began to converse in Spanish. The agent stated the male employee then gave him back his identification and the female clerk then completed the sale. The agent later completed a witness statement that was submitted with this report.

I entered the location, identified myself to the clerk (Liliana Arizmendi), and requested to return the beer and obtain the \$20 bill used during the operation. I had previously recorded the serial number of the bill and later recovered it from the register. Store owner and liquor license holder, Robert Crimo, was in the store during the transaction and became visibly upset with Arizmendi. I showed Crimo the agent's vertically printed Secretary of State identification used during the operation and he confronted Arizmendi about her ability to calculate age.

Crimo pointed out a piece of paper taped on the front counter near the register area with a year written on it. Crimo stated the clerks were advised to not sell to anyone born after the year. There was also a liquor control commission "Don't be Sorry" color Illinois license recognition mat on the front counter that I had previously supplied to the store on 16 October 2013, see incident 2012-12554.

Arizmendi stated she looked at the identification but calculated the date of birth wrong. Arizmendi also stated she was not certified in responsible server training. Crimo indicated Arizmendi is a new employee and has not yet had the training but will have completed the required course before the administrative hearing date.

I issued Arizmendi administrative citations HP014555 for sale of alcohol to person underage in violation of Highland Park City Code 119.525(A) and HP014558 for sale of alcohol without proof of responsible server training in violation of Highland Park City Code 119.410(C)(1) with a scheduled appearance date of 11 November 2013 at 09:00 AM for both citations.

On above date at approximately 12:15PM, Detective Rash and Sergeant Bonaguidi responded to Bob's Pantry at 55 St. Johns. Upon arrival, they hand delivered the Findings and Order reference Hearing Number 2013-02 to Mr. Robert Crimo. Mr. Crimo asked when the order took effect. He was told that per the order, it took effect that day. Mr. Crimo had no further questions and related he would comply with the order.

The proof of service form was signed and dated by Detective Rash and notarized by Sergeant Bonaguidi. The original proof of service form was hand delivered to Deputy City Clerk Fulara the next day by Sergeant Bonaguidi. A copy of the order and proof of delivery are attached.

This supplemental report is written in addition to the original offense report. While performing tobacco compliance checks on 18 December 2013, Bob's Pantry was inspected to ensure they were in compliance with the Liquor Commission suspension of their liquor license. No alcohol was observed for sale at the business and many of the rear coolers were empty.

FINDINGS AND ORDER

This order ("*Order*") concerns City of Highland Park Liquor License No. 144-13 ("*License*") issued to Bob's Pantry & Deli, Inc. d/b/a Bob's Pantry & Deli ("*Licensee*"). The Local Liquor Control Commission of the City of Highland Park ("*Commission*"), being duly advised in the premises, DOES FIND AS FOLLOWS:

1. The License is a Class S-2 liquor license issued pursuant to Chapter 119 of "the Highland Park City Code of 1968," as amended ("*City Code*").
2. The License was issued to the Licensee on January 1, 2013, and is valid through December 31, 2013.
3. The License authorizes the sale of beer and wine at retail, for consumption off the premises only, at the business commonly known as Bob's Pantry & Deli, located at the property commonly known as 55 St. Johns Avenue, Highland Park, Illinois ("*Property*").
4. Section 119.410(C)(1) of the City Code requires that employees of local liquor licensees engaged in the sale of alcoholic liquor must first complete a responsible alcohol service training program.
5. Section 119.525(A) of the City Code prohibits the sale of alcoholic liquor to any person under the age of 21 years.
6. On October 4, 2013, at approximately 4:45 p.m., during a standard compliance check of City local liquor licensees, Liliana Arizmendi, an employee of the Licensee, sold alcoholic liquor to a special agent of the Highland Park Police Department, which special agent was under the age of 21 years.
7. At the time of such sale, Liliana Arizmendi had not completed a responsible alcoholic service program, as required by the City Code.
8. On October 4, 2013, the Highland Park Police Department issued citations to Liliana Arizmendi for: (a) the sale of alcoholic liquor prior to completion of a responsible alcohol service training program, in violation of Section 119.410(C)(1) of the City Code; and (b) the sale of alcoholic liquor to a person under the age of 21 years, in violation of Section 119.525(A) of the City Code.

9. On November 21, 2013, the City Administrative Hearing Officer found Liliana Arizmendi guilty of one violation of Section 119.410(C)(1) of the City Code and one violation of Section 119.525(A) of the City Code, and fined Liliana Arizmendi \$150.00, plus \$40.00 in costs, for each violation.

10. On April 19, 2012, the Commission issued an order in Hearing No. 2012-01, fining the Licensee and imposing a suspension of its local liquor license due to a separate violation of Section 119.525(A) of the City Code.

11. Section 119.601(B) of the City Code authorizes the City Local Liquor Control Commissioner to fine a local liquor licensee, and to revoke or suspend a local liquor license, upon any violation by a local liquor licensee, or by its agents or employees, of any provision of Chapter 119 of the City Code.

12. The Commission has jurisdiction pursuant to 235 ILCS 5/7-5, and Section 119.610 of the City Code, to conduct a hearing regarding the possible imposition of penalties upon the Licensee or against the Licensee.

13. Due notice of a hearing to consider the imposition of fines against the Licensee, and of a suspension or revocation of the License, was served upon the Licensee in accordance with Section 119.610 of the City Code and applicable law.

14. The hearing was conducted by the Commission, and proofs were taken and adduced before a quorum of the members of the Commission, at a meeting of the Commission held in the Highland Park City Hall on December 2, 2013 ("Hearing").

15. The Licensee was present at the Hearing.

16. The Licensee testified at the Hearing that some of its employees have not successfully completed a responsible alcohol service training program, as required by Section 119.410 of the City Code and by the Commission's Order in Hearing No. 2012-01.

17. At the conclusion of the Hearing, the Local Liquor Control Commission expressed its unanimous support of the Local Liquor Control Commissioner's entry of this Order:

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

A. Not later than January 9, 2014, the Licensee must pay the following amounts to the City of Highland Park: (1) a \$1,500.00 fine for the violation of Section 119.525(A) of the City Code, for use as directed by the Local Liquor Control Commission; (2) a \$1,000.00 fine for the violation of Section 119.410(C)(1) of the City Code, for use in connection with the underage alcohol education program of the City; and (3) reimbursement for the attorneys' fees and court reporter costs incurred by the City in connection with the Hearing, in an amount to be determined by the City Clerk and delivered in writing to the Licensee. The payments required pursuant to this Section A must be made to "City of Highland Park" and delivered to the Office of the City Clerk.

B. All managers of the Licensee, and all employees of the Licensee who are required to complete a responsible alcohol service training program pursuant to Section 119.410 of the City Code, must successfully complete such a program.

C. The Licensee must file all new or amended tax returns, and pay all due taxes to the City, as required pursuant to Chapter 97 of the City Code.

D. The License is hereby suspended for a period of not less than 30 calendar days, beginning on the date of this Order and ending on the date identified in Section G of this Order ("*Suspension Period*").

E. The Licensee must post signage at the Property during the Suspension Period that states: "By order of the Local Liquor Control Commission of the City of Highland Park, no alcoholic liquor may be sold, given away, or purchased in this store or upon these premises until further notice." Such signage must remain posted clearly and conspicuously at the Property until the conclusion of the Suspension Period.

F. During the Suspension Period, in order to prevent the sale of alcoholic liquor until the conclusion of the Suspension Period, the Licensee must: (1) remove all alcoholic liquor from public display within the Property, to the extent practicable; and (2) install locks on all refrigeration cases within the Property containing alcoholic liquor.

G. The Suspension Period will conclude upon the later to occur of: (1) the date that is 30 calendar days after the date of this Order; and (2) the submission by the Licensee to the City Clerk of verification that all obligations set forth in Sections A through C of this Order have been completed.

H. The Local Liquor Control Commissioner is directed to refuse to issue a local liquor license to the Licensee for calendar year 2014 until the conclusion of the Suspension Period.

On November 30, 2017, I Detective Bodden conducted tobacco compliance checks using an 18 year old female agent, see Highland Park case #17-18975 for operational guidelines followed during the checks of licensed tobacco retailers.

At approximately 9:24 am, the agent successfully purchased a pack of Camel cigarettes from Bob's Pantry located at 55 St Johns Ave. I witnessed the transaction, and observed the store clerk, later identified as Paul Crimo, take the agent's vertically printed State of Illinois Drivers License before the sale and appear to examine it. Paul stated her age of 18 years old and completed the sale. I retrieved the change from the transaction and the pack of cigarettes and proceeded back into the store. The agent didn't obtain receipt from the transaction and the agent had recorded the \$10 dollar bill in her possession in the event she was sold tobacco and no other funds pursuant to operational directives.

I announced my office to Paul and advised him that he had sold to a person under the age of 18. He admitted that he did sell to her and forgot the age for tobacco sales was 21.

Paul retrieved the marked \$10 dollar bill from his register and returned it to me. I notified Dispatch of the incident and obtained the report number.

Paul was issued a written warning (257251) for Sale of tobacco to a minor, Highland Park Municipal Code 125.007(A).

On Tuesday, 03/16/10, at approximately 2:52 PM, a 25 year old female, working as an agent of the Highland Park Police Department (HPPD), went in to Bob's Pantry and Deli (55 St. Johns Ave.). The agent attempted to buy both alcohol and tobacco products since Robert Crimo, the owner of the business, does not have a current permit to sell either alcohol or tobacco products from the City of Highland Park.

I observed the agent enter Bob's Pantry and Deli at approximately 2:52 PM. Prior to her entry in to the store, I searched her belongings to ensure that she was not in possession of any liquor or tobacco products. At approximately 2:56 PM, I observed the agent walk out of the store holding a pack of cigarettes and a bottle of water.

Officer Spanos and I met with the agent right away. The agent handed us one pack of Marlboro Ultra Lights cigarettes, a 20 ounce bottle of Aquafina water, and \$12.40 in change (she used a \$20 bill to purchase the cigarettes). The agent stated that she was charged \$7.60 for the items and was not given a receipt. The agent stated that Robert waited on her (which she confirmed again after seeing his picture on the store's website). As for the alcohol, the agent stated that the cooler doors to the alcoholic beverages were locked. She stated that she asked Robert about the alcohol and he told her that they were waiting on some paperwork.

Officer Spanos and I took possession of the pack of cigarettes, water, and the change. I took photos of the cigarettes, water, and change.

We returned to the HPPD, where I entered the cigarettes and water in to the BEAST as evidence. I entered the photos in to Digital Evidence.

On 03/19/10, Officer Spanos and I were in Bob's Pantry and Deli on case #10-03227, also for selling tobacco without a permit. Since Robert was not in the store, Officer Spanos spoke with him over the phone. When advised that we were going to cite him for not having a license to sell tobacco products, Robert told Officer Spanos that he did not know that he needed one. Robert told Officer Spanos to give his citations to his brother Paul Crimo.

I issued Robert administrative citation #HP013761 for license required for retail sale (125.003). The court date is set for 04/15/10 at 1:30 PM. I gave the citation to Paul.

It should be noted that Officer Spanos cited Robert for selling tobacco without a license on 11/10/09. He also cited him that day for failure to obtain a restaurant license (115.010). After that administrative hearing, Robert obtained his 2009 tobacco license in December of 2009, which expired at the end of 12/31/09. Since the 2009 tobacco license expired, Robert has not possessed a 2010 tobacco license.

OfficerID: Jfarr, Narrative Supplement

On March 16, 2010, Officer Farr was directed by Commander Cameron, while assigned to investigations, to attempt to purchase alcohol and cigarettes from Bob's Pantry at 55 St. Johns Ave. Officer Farr was informed that the liquor and tobacco license at Bob's Pantry was currently expired, however there were reports that they were still selling both items to the public.

At approx. 2:52pm, on March 16, 2010, Officer Farr arrived at 55 St. Johns Road, Bob's Pantry, for a possible Ordinance violation. Officer Farr entered Bob's Pantry, in plain clothes, and approached the liquor cooler. Officer Farr observed a sign posted on the cooler that stated that the business could not sell any alcoholic beverages at the time because they were still trying to obtain the proper permits. Officer Farr also was unable to open the cooler doors that contained alcoholic beverages, as they had been locked. Officer Farr, instead grabbed a bottle of water and proceeded to the counter to purchase cigarettes. Officer Farr observed no signs posted near the tobacco display that stated that the business could not sell any tobacco products. Officer Farr did observe a very low quantity and poor selection of tobacco products, which is abnormal for a business who sells tobacco products. Officer Farr also observed a customer, prior to her in line, purchase cigarettes. When it was Officer Farr's turn to checkout, she requested to purchase a pack of Marlboro Ultra Lights. There was no hesitation from the unidentified employee who was completing the transaction. Officer Farr asked the unidentified employee if she could also purchase a six pack of beer. The unidentified employee denied her request, stating that "they were waiting on important paperwork before they could sell to anyone." Officer Farr paid \$7.60 for the bottle of water and a pack of Marlboro Ultra Lights. Officer Farr left Bob's pantry at 2:56pm upon completion of the transaction.

Utilizing the business' website, the unidentified employee without a name badge was later identified as Robert E. Crimo, the owner of the business.

Follow up and citing the business for selling tobacco without a valid Highland Park permit to be completed by Investigations.

Once we arrived I met with Officers Girona and Montemayor. Officer Girona was the first officer that arrived at the scene and spoke to the reporting person (See Suppl.), and Officer Montemayor was processing the scene. They advised me an unknown person threw a piece of concrete through the front door window and gained entry into the store. The offender stole money (USC) out of one of the cashier drawers, out of a money bag under the register counter, and several packages of Newport cigarettes. They showed me the piece of concrete which was found on the floor inside the store. The concrete was irregular in shape and approximately 5 to 6 inches in diameter. Outside the store, on the ground in the rear of the store, the officers found a new Newport cigarette package.

I spoke to the owner's brother, Paul Crimo. Paul had stated his brother Bob had closed the store at 7:30pm on 3/17/2017 and left at 7:45pm. Paul stated the store does not have a burglar alarm system, but does have a surveillance camera system that records events inside as well as outside the store. His brother Bob was at home trying to pull up the footage. The drawer was located underneath the register counter, separate from the actual cash register. The drawer had a key lock on the front but the key was inside of it. Paul stated the drawer is always left unlocked and they never take the key out. The offender took all the USC out of it except four rolls of pennies. Underneath that cash drawer is more shelving for various items. Paul stated they also keep money in a money pouch with a zipper closure. That bag was found moved and empty. We checked the cash drawer that is actually part of the register to see if that had been attacked, but all the money from the previous night appeared to still be inside. Paul stated that drawer was harder to open because the offender would have to know which button on the face of the register to push.

Bob arrived at the store and told us he had retained the footage from his surveillance system. He showed us the footage on his office computer. At 9:01pm the audio noise indicates glass smashing in the area of the front door. The camera then shows a piece of concrete entering the store. The concrete slid along the floor, struck the cabinet that displays the soup for sale and comes to a rest in the adjacent aisle. The offender is able to access the lock on the inside of the front door, unlock it, and enter the store. He walks behind the register counter from walkway near the deli display. He attacks the register drawer and removes the money. He then turns to face the cigarettes display. He takes an unknown amount of cigarette packages and starts to walk away. He then stops and returns back to the register. He bends over, but goes off camera. He then walks out from behind the counter and exits out the damaged door.

Bob allows Officer Montemayor to capture screen shots of the offender. The offender from the video is described as:
- Male Black, 30's years of age, 5'08" to 6'01", wearing a red in color winter hat with the Chicago Bulls logo on the front, gray in color jacket with a black in color front, blue jeans and dark colored shoes.
I asked Bob for a copy of the video that he retained from the incident. He stated he would have to give it to me later since it would take time to make a copy. I provided him my business card with the incident number on it.

Det. Flaig and I returned back to the police department and sent out a Critical Reach with the still photos provided by Officer Montemayor. Officer Montemayor also advised me that Bob Crimo refused to allow him to take the cash register drawer, the money pouch and cigarette tray display for processing claiming he needed it for his business.

Shortly later we received notice from a refused witness that there was a smashed window at the Braeside Train Station, which is located across the street from Bob's Pantry (17-04180). After reviewing the surveillance cameras, I could see the same offender from Bob's Pantry get off the south bound train at 8:54pm. Return back to Braeside Train Station at 9:07pm and damage a window. See report 17-04180.

At 2:17pm I received an email from Paul Crimo. Attached in the email was a copy of the video surveillance of the burglary at Bob's Pantry. I placed the video footage into digital evidence.

On 06/27/2014 at approximately 10:44 pm, I was dispatched to Bob's Pantry and Deli at 55 St Johns Avenue regarding telephone harassment. There I met with caller and Owner of Bob's Pantry, Robert E Crimo. Crimo stated that for the past 3 weeks he and his frequent customer Daniel Levine have been receiving numerous phone calls from unknown numbers. When Crimo would answer, the unknown callers would immediately hang up. These calls have been coming in through Bob's Pantry and Deli's business phone. Crimo said that each call had a different number and that he believed the callers were "spoofing" the calls meaning the numbers seen on his caller ID did not match that of the actual caller.

Crimo said that Levine had been receiving similar phone calls. Levine frequently hangs out in Bob's Pantry and Deli. While Levine was in Bob's Pantry, Crimo said he received a phone call with Levine's listed cell phone number. At the same time, Levine showed Crimo his cell phone and confirmed that he was not the one calling. [REDACTED] Crimo thought the calls were related to someone trying to "mess" with Levine.

I spoke with Levine via phone. Levine said that he has been receiving the same type of calls for the last 3 weeks. Levine did not have any idea who was behind the calls and did not necessarily think the callers were tied to Bob's Pantry and Deli. Levine also mentioned that he has recently had incidents where he would receive 15-25 text messages simultaneously from unknown numbers.

Crimo said he would at times receive 3-5 calls a day over the last 3 weeks. The Admiral Theater, a 7-Eleven located in Glencoe, and Captain Nemos in Glencoe, have been among the businesses listed on the caller ID that were from the unknown callers. Crimo said he has called these businesses back and they stated they had no knowledge of ever calling him. Crimo said he wanted the incidents investigated since the calls have been disrupting his business. Crimo went through the caller ID history at Bob's Pantry and Deli but the only number listed from the unknown callers was Levine's number.

On 05/28/11 at 0027 hours, Officers Girona, Wagner and I, Officer DiBasilio, were dispatched to 1566 McDaniels Avenue in reference to a domestic dispute. Commander Wilinski arrived on-scene.

Robert advised the argument stemmed from her wanting to drive to Chicago to meet with the police. Robert would not let her drive because she was so intoxicated, but told her he would drive to Chicago to meet with the police. Robert had to have her stay at home and watch their kids while he was gone, but she insisted she was okay to drive. Robert told Denise if she got into the car, he would call the police. Denise then, beat Robert to the punch, and called the police. Robert was cooperative and agreed to leave for the remainder of the night. I advised Robert the incident would be documented.

After several attempts to calm Denise down, she finally complied and agreed to go in the house.

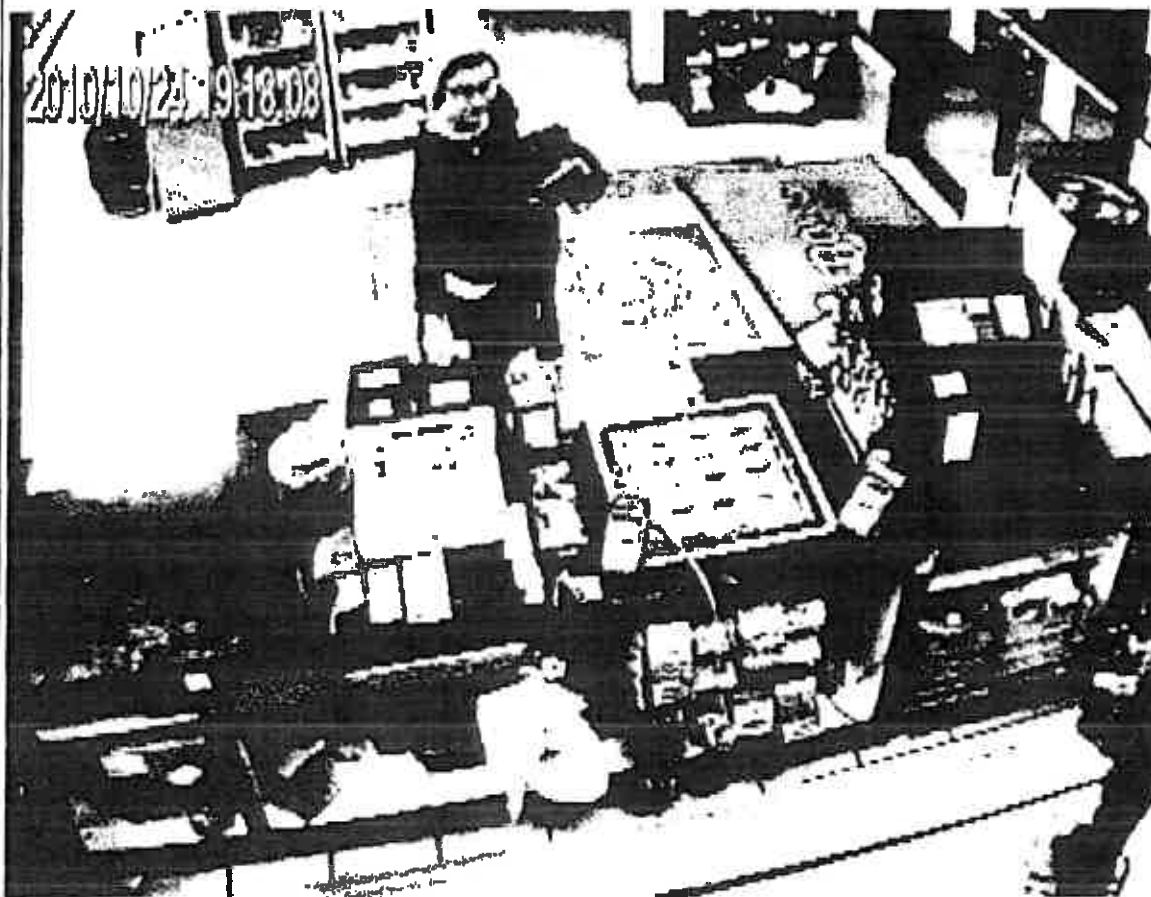

On May 21, 2010 I, Ofc Bodden was dispatched to the area of 2057 Green Bay Rd reference to a 9-1-1 call from a witness that a female in a grey vehicle was screaming for help asking the caller to call 9-1-1.

On scene, Ofc DeCristoforo was speaking with the witness, identified as [REDACTED]. He related the following in summary: He was coming out of Custom Framing and hear a violent screaming from a female yelling for help and yelling at someone to get out of her car, give me my keys. He witnessed a female sitting in a vehicle with a white/ hispanic male wearing a white tee-shirt. This continued for about 2-3 minutes before he decided to call 9-1-1.

The white male/ hispanic exited the vehicle and the vehicle sped away from the scene. The male was described wearing a white tee shirt with a back pack and a black sweater across his back. He was last seen walking north on Green Bay Rd from the scene.

As Ofc DeCristoforo was gathering more information, I checked the immediate area for the subject. As I approached the Shell Gas station at Green Bay and First St, I observed the subject on the west side of the building.

I notified dispatch and asked the subject if I could speak with him. He said yeah and started to approach me. He appeared to be nervous and frightened and I observed what appeared to be blood stains on the sleeve of his right arm and I asked him what was going on. He was anxiously looking around and told me that he just had a little argument with his girl friend and that everything was cool. I asked him where his girl friend was at and he said that she left that way, pointing towards the north, in her car.

I told him that I was called for some type of an argument down the street, as I took a step toward him, he looked over both shoulders and kept looking towards the east side of the gas station and took a few steps away from me. I asked him where he was going, he didn't answer and I told him that I still wanted to talk with him however he continued to walk away. I told him that there was a complaint of a girl screaming and that he matched the description. I asked him about the blood on his shirt and he told me that his girlfriend bite him in the arm. He took two more steps, I informed him that he was obstructing and that I only wanted to find out what had occurred between them. As he took another step, I informed him that he was under arrest for interference of a Police Officer, which I placed my left hand on his left hand and my right arm on his left shoulder blade and attempted to take him into custody. As he was pulling away from me, I informed him to stop resisting that I am investigating a possible domestic that occurred. I escorted him to my patrol vehicle and placed him in custody for the Interference of a public official.

He was identified as David F Daniels. I observed a laceration and bit marks on his right bicep and he refused medical attention. I asked him who bit him and he informed Detective Fishman and myself that he got into an argument with his girlfriend Denise Pesina.

David was transported to the Police Department and placed into the interview room. I advised David of his Miranda Warnings which he waived his right to an attorney.

David related the following in summary: For the last two years he has been having a sexual relationship with a girl he met in [REDACTED] who is married, Denise Pesina. Since about a year ago, their relationship has turned for the worse when he started talking with another girl and told Denise about it. She became verbally abusive towards David since then and they had recent contact with the Buffalo Grove Police Department. Since he had known Denise, he wanted to take their relationship to the next level as boyfriend and girlfriend, Denise kept telling him that she was going to leave her husband, however after two years is still with him. Recently he decided that there was nothing for him here in Highland Park and that he was looking to finish his college degree and move to Evanston. He hinted around to moving to Denise.

Earlier in the morning him and Denise had breakfast together. Later on in the day, he went to Starbucks and purchased a Tea and Denise came and picked him up. As they left the parking lot, David told her that he made the decision to move to Evanston. She pulled the car over and they started to argue. She called his mother and during the conversation, he wasn't sure, someone hung up on the other. He's not sure if it was her or his mother, however they continued to argue. She struck him and he waived his arms to keep her from hitting him and my have inadvertently struck her. At some point, she grabbed the tea and threw it all over the vehicle. He admitted to striking her with his arms because she was attacking him. She yelled at him to get out of the vehicle, as he was trying to get out, she bit his right bicep (photographs taken) She continued yelling at him to get out of the vehicle, which he grabbed his bags and started walking down Green Bay Rd. David started a written statement, however didn't want to write anymore (see attached).

Det Fishman interviewed Denise (see narrative supplemental) and written statement. I asked David about the ignition keys. He said that he removed them from the vehicle because he didn't want he to leave before he got his things out of the car. He admitted to grabbing the keys in a manner that the ring broke and that there probably was damage to the key. There was a previous incident in Buffalo Grove which he did the same thing as the were driving 40 mph down the road. I asked him about the telephone and after speaking with him, he admitted to grabbing the phone from her. Photographs of Denise's injury were taken.

I asked David why he resisted me. David related that he was unsure what was happening and that he believed that I was going to beat him up that's why he began walking away from me and apologized for resisting.

David was processed and cited for Battery (#25004) and Interference with public official (#25005). He was released on a Recognizance Bond to appear in traffic court on June 23, 2010 at 3:00 pm.

Nothing further.

OfficerID: Sfishman, Narrative Supplement

I responded to the area of the Shell Mart where Ofc. Bodden called out on the radio that he was attempting to stop a suspect who matched the witness' description of the offender in a battery. I observed the suspect attempt to pull away from Ofc. Bodden when he was trying to handcuff the suspect. The suspect was brought under control and handcuffed by Bodden.

The suspect stated that he got into an argument with his girlfriend Denise Pesina who lives on McDaniels. I went to 1566 McDaniels and located Pesina who drove up to her house in the described vehicle. Pesina stated that she was involved in an argument with the suspect and I asked her to come to the PSC. She stated that she needed to wait for her son's school bus which was coming down the street. I asked Pesina to make arrangements for someone to watch her son and she stated that a friend could watch him but she had to drop him off. Pesina dropped off her son and came to the PSC.

Pesina related the following in summary: She and the suspect were driving in her car and got into an argument about where the suspect was going to live in Evanston. Pesina didn't like where the suspect wanted to live so she called his mother on her cell phone to voice her opinion. The suspect became upset that she was talking to his mother and attempted to grab the cell phone out of her hand. The vehicle was parked at this time while they were struggling over the cell phone. Pesina said this has happened before and she was afraid her new phone was going to get broken. During the struggle, the suspect attempted to reach across her body and remove the car keys from the ignition. Pesina said this has also happened in the past and the suspect has thrown the keys out of her car and she spent a lot of time looking for them. During the struggle, the key ring bent causing the single ignition key to come loose and fall on the floor. Pesina said she started screaming for someone to call 911 and told the suspect to get out of her car. At some point while they were struggling over the phone and the car keys, Pesina bit the suspect on the arm.

Pesina completed a witness statement at the PSC. Pesina stated that she has had a relationship with the suspect on and off for about two years even though she is married to Robert Crimo Jr. [REDACTED] She is more like a friend to the suspect because [REDACTED] She stated she would like the relationship to be more boyfriend and girlfriend even though she is married but the suspect doesn't want that. [REDACTED] They have had several arguments over the time they have known each other and the police have been called. During the interview, the victim stated that the suspect had called Crimo a few days ago and "rubbed it in his face" about [REDACTED] She was concerned for her safety and the suspect's because Crimo had guns in the house. [REDACTED]

I contacted felony review and spoke with Jill Richter who consulted with Steve Scheller and stated that there is not enough probable cause for a search warrant for Crimo's residence. Pesina stated that she knows he has at least one handgun in a safe in his separate bedroom but she does not have a key to it. At this time, Crimo came to the PSC and wanted to see his wife. I explained to him the circumstances and he voluntarily agreed to turn over to HPPD any handguns that he owned. Crimo went to his residence and retrieved two handguns and brought them to the PSC for safekeeping. I advised Crimo that [REDACTED] In addition, he was advised that he would have to become compliant with the city ordinance in order to get his guns back. Crimo was not charged with either offense since he voluntarily turned over the handguns. He was issued a copy of the property sheet for the weapons and I wrote on it that he must comply with state and local laws before he can get them back. The weapons a Smith and Wesson .357 #S181917 and a Jennings .22 cal #294943 were placed in evidence for safekeeping. [REDACTED]

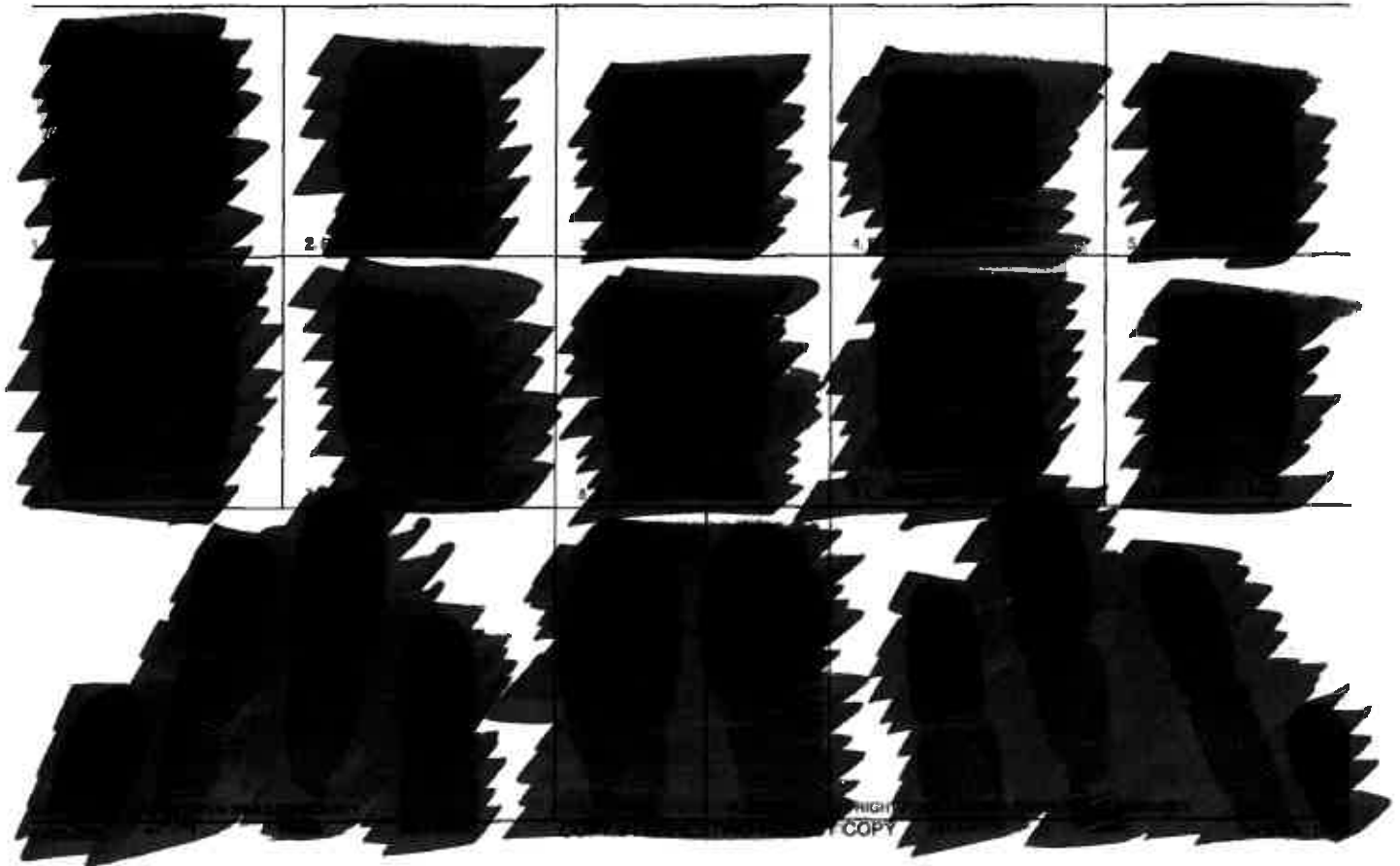
