A motion to approve the agenda for the meeting was made by Paul Shafer, seconded by Mary Anderson. The vote to approve was unanimous.

A motion to approve the August minutes was made by Paul Shafer, seconded by Chris O’Neill. The vote to approve was unanimous.

The fall lighted event schedule for 2010 was reviewed. We used 13 regular lighted event nights and 4 special occasions, where lights were turned on to finish an event safely. Spring dates will be posted by late winter for the spring.

Chris O’Neill reported that there were very few incidents reported regarding traffic issues or other issues on Football nights this past fall.
