

**Wolters Field Advisory Group Meeting
Thursday, November 9, 2006**

- I. Welcome and Introduction – The following Advisory members were present: Athletic Director Bobbie Monroe, Police Chief Paul Shafer, District 113 Assistant Superintendent Barry Bolek, Councilman Jim Kirsch, and community representatives Kevin Fassett and Brigid Ohlwein. Also present was community member David Greenberg.**

- II. Review of Fall Light Schedule – We have used 11 regular dates with lights, one play-off football date and two special dates later in the season when darkness came early. The ordinance allows a total of 25 regular dates, 3 possible football play-off dates and 7 special occasions.**

- III. Fall Season Feedback – The level of sound coming from the PA system was discussed. A representative from the sound company will be asked to check the PA system and speakers before the spring sports begin. If possible, a governor will be placed on the system to keep the sound level consistent for each game. Supervision of the neighborhood was discussed and a staff person will be put in place for the entire game on Centerfield Ct. to keep the traffic from entering and turning around. The supervisors at the neighborhood posts will be provided with a method of communication. The school will work with the Chief Shafer to find an appropriate drop-off area next to the field on grassy area west of the Administration building. Chief Shafer will also look into the process of parking permits given to the neighbors around Wolters Field. There are two neighbors who declined fencing provided by District 113 bordering our property. There has been neighborhood concern on this issue.**
